

One of the Society's most distinguished members, Sir John Nott, died on 6th November 2024, at the age of 92. An obituary will appear in the Annual Report for 2024






The Cadogan Family

We arranged a private tour for a small number of our members to The Wallace Collection on Wednesday 15th January.


The splendour of this Collection in the magnificent setting of Hertford House, and our very well-informed guide, were greatly appreciated.

Robert Hardman



Robert Hardman met with The Chelsea Society on Monday 4th November. 6-8pm at Chelsea Old Town Hall.

He is a renowned writer and broadcaster, specializing in royalty and history for more than twenty-five years. He is the author of several international bestsellers. His latest book being about King Charles III. His book about Queen Eizabeth II, 'Queen of Our Times: The Life of Elizabeth II', was the 2022 Sunday Times Biography of the Year and was presented by Prime Minister Boris Johnson to Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky in the same year.

Hardman has also written 'Monarchy: The Royal Family at Work', 'Our Queen, and Queen of the World', along with globally acclaimed television documentaries of the same names.

Germany's role in the defence of Europe

Prof. Matthias Strohn M.St. (Oxon), DPhil (Oxon), FRHistS is a Lt. Col. in the German Army reserve, and is attached to the German Military Delegation in the UK. He spoke to The Chelsea Society at 6-8pm on Monday 2nd September 2024 at Chelsea Old Town Hall.

He explained how thinking in Germany about defence has changed from 1945 when nobody wanted a German army, to the present day when Germans and their allies realise that Germany has a vital role to play in the defence of Europe.

Houseboats

The Chelsea Society has been fighting, with other local people, to protect the essential character of Chelsea Reach, because the current owner of the moorings has been evicting traditional houseboats and replacing them with much larger box-like floating structures of uniform design and appearance.

The Planning Applications Committee of RBKC has decided on no less than three separate occasions that this activity constitutes a breach of planning control by reason of intensification, and has issued an Enforcement Notice to compel the removal of two mega-boats.



The owner of the moorings appealed against these decisions and the Society was very disappointed to find on 1st November 2024 that his appeal had been allowed.

The Planning Inspector accepted that the question whether the introduction of the mega-boats constitutes a change in the fundamental character of Chelsea Reach is a matter of opinion for the decision-maker, but she has seen fit to substitute her opinion for that of fifteen elected Councillors of both political parties, and for that of the Chelsea Society and The Cheyne Walk Trust, The Lots Road Neighbourhood Forum, the residents of the houseboats, and very many other local people who submitted written objections.



Oscar Wilde

On 16th October 2024 The Chelsea Society was represented by its Chairman and members of Council at the unveiling on Dovehouse Green of a sculpture by Sir Eduardo Paolozzi of the head of Oscar Wilde.

Greg Hands

The Chairman of the Society has written to thank Greg Hands for his service to Chelsea whilst its MP, and for all the help he has given to the Society.

Benches neglected - update



The benches on the Embankment are an important part of Chelsea's riverside heritage but they are in an appalling state. If woodwork exposed to the weather is not properly maintained, it becomes de-natured and eventually has to be replaced.

These benches are the responsibility of TfL, and The Chelsea Society has persuaded them to carry out a refurbishment programme. The benches between Chelsea Bridge and Albert Bridge are now looking much better, but the benches between Albert Bridge and Battersea Bridge are still in a neglected state.

Blue Plaque - Sir Henry Rushbury





The Chelsea Society has proposed to English Heritage a Blue Plaque for Sir Henry Rushbury KCVO CBE RA, at 8 Netherton Grove, Chelsea, London SW10 9TQ where he lived and worked from 1927-1951.

He met and married the Chelsea born artist Florence Layzell in 1914, and became a war artist. Thirty of his works are in the Imperial War Museum. Rushbury developed an individual style in watercolours, moved in the hallowed artistic circle of the time of Frances Dodd, Muirhead Bone, Ethelbert and Betty White, Charles Cundell and Alan Gwynne-Jones.

In 1927 he bought 8 Netherton Grove in Chelsea, and built

his studio in the garden. He had been elected as an Associate Academician, and in 1936, was promoted to full membership of the Royal Academy. In 1938, he became Chairman of the Chelsea Arts Club.

In WW2 Rushbury was again a war artist and documented industrial centres in the North of England and Scotland. He stayed at 8 Netherton Grove during the war. In 1949 he was elected Keeper of the Royal Academy Schools, and was knighted in 1964. There is a catalogue of his prints at the Royal Academy.

Holy Trinity

The Chelsea Society was represented by its Vice-chairman at the Induction and Installation of The Revd. Canon Michael Robinson as the new Rector of Holy Trinity Church, Sloane St., by The Rt. Revd. the Bishop of Kensington, in the presence of four other Bishops.

The Chelsea Society and very many local people objected to this planning application, but two Chelsea members of the RBKC Planning Applications Committee abstained, thereby allowing permission for demolition and rebuilding to be granted. The Mayor of London has decided to let the development go ahead.

The Chairman of the Planning Committee of the Chelsea Society, Sir Paul Lever, had written to the RBKC and the Mayor of London to object.

Skyscraper proposal

There is a proposal to build a skyscraper at the south end of Battersea Bridge.

The Chelsea Society exists to safeguard the unique heritage of our part of London and we have objected to this proposal due to the severe potential damage to the historic and celebrated views of and from the conservation areas along Chelsea's north bank of the River Thames, a designated Area of Metropolitan Importance.

The proposed skyscraper is vastly too tall for the space and location envisaged. It breaches Wandsworth Council's Planning Policy set out in July 2023 where the height restriction is 12 storeys and where regeneration is favoured over demolition in order to meet Zero Carbon policy goals. It is also completely out of keeping with the heights of the immediately surrounding buildings

Sloane Square

The Society has been consulted by Cadogan and RBKC about the possible widening of pavements around the Square.

Easing pedestrian congestion would be a good idea, provided it can be done without impeding traffic flows around the Square.

Members may be interested to know that in its very first Annual Report (1928) the Council of the Society said that "It is naturally interested in the prospective layout of Sloane Square, where the roundabout traffic system has been permanently adopted. Various attractive suggestions have been made, but it is understood that apart from financial considerations, there are difficulties due to the Underground Railway and the existing public conveniences.

The Borough Council have courteously promised, through our late Chairman, Sir Albert Gray KCB, KC, that the Society shall have an opportunity of seeing the plans when these have taken shape."







The Royal Hospital

The Chelsea Society was represented by its Chairman and Vice-chairman at the Founder's Day parade at the Royal Hospital on 6th June 2024.

The salute was taken by The Princess Royal, who made a short speech and met pensioners who had served in the Second World War. Two of them had landed on the Normandy beaches 80 years ago.
